## Craven museums gain national quality standard

Two museums in Grassington and Settle have been officially 'Accredited' by the Museums, Libraries and Archives Council (MLA).

The Museum of North Craven Life (located in The Folly in Settle) and the Upper Wharfedale Folk Museum in Grassington have worked hard over the past year to gain the coveted Museum Accreditation standard. Both museums are run by volunteers who have drawn on the expertise and guidance available from staff at Craven District Council's Craven Museum & Gallery to help them gain the Accreditation.

The MLA's Museum Accreditation Scheme sets national agreed standards for all museums in the UK. The award proves that the museums measure up, meeting the guidelines on how they are run, how they look after their collections and the services that they provide for visitors. Being accredited holds many benefits for the museums particularly in their relationships with funding organisations and external bodies.
